## Alliteration:

When words that start with the same sound (not just the same letter) are found repeatedly in a phrase or sentence, that's alliteration. The sound is usually a consonant and the words don't have to be right next to one another.

Look at the title of this page. Do you see it? **W**ords... **W**ith... **W**hitney.. That's alliteration!

If you've caught this concept quickly, let's leap into the next lesson. Alliteration happens when words near to each other share the same sound, but they don't always begin with the same letter. Concept and quickly don't begin with the same letter, but they do both start with a hard C sound.

Also, **Sibilance** is a special category of alliteration where the words sound like a hissing snake. See if you can find sibilance in, The Super Special, Altogether Ordinary Day.
