Alliteration:

When words that start with the same sound (not just the same letter) are found repeatedly in a phrase or sentence, that's alliteration. The sound is usually a consonant and the words don't have to be right next to one another.

Look at the title of this page. Do you see it? <u>W</u>ords... <u>W</u>ith... <u>W</u>hitney.. That's alliteration!

If you've <u>caught this concept <u>qu</u>ickly, <u>let's leap</u> into the next <u>lesson</u>. Alliteration happens when words near to each other share the same sound, but they don't always begin with the same letter. <u>Concept and <u>qu</u>ickly don't begin with the same letter, but they do both start with a hard C sound.</u></u>

Also, **Sibilance** is a special category of alliteration where the words sound like a hissing snake. See if you can find sibilance in, <u>The Super Special</u>, <u>Altogether Ordinary Day</u>.
